In Year 1 pupils researched the Olympian Dina Asher-Smith and in Year 2 pupils the broadcaster and presenter Charlene White.

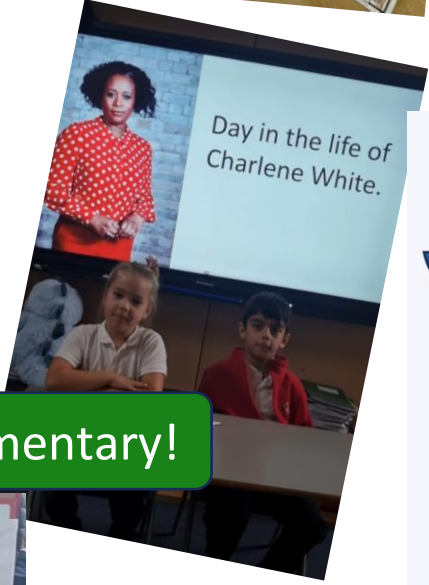
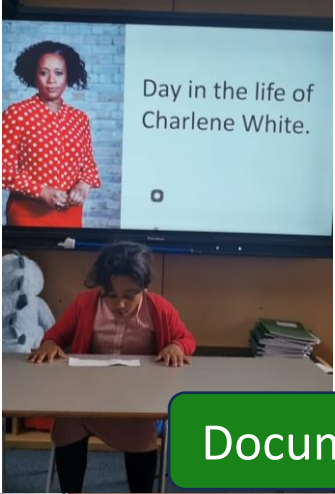
